## **VOLUNTARY LOAD DISCLOSURE SCHEME**

**Last Chance for Regularise Unauthorised Load of Agriculture Connection**

**From 1 January to 31 January, 2016**

Jaipur 31<sup>st</sup> Dec. To improve the quality of power supply and to prevent the revenue loss in Agriculture Sector in Rajasthan, Rajasthan Discoms have decided to implement the voluntary load disclosure scheme(VLDS) for one month as a last chance for the agriculture consumers of the state. This scheme will be effective for the period of one month from 1<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2016 to 31<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2016. If excess load found during load verification after 31<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2016 penalty will be charged as per rules.

Chairman Discoms Sh.Bhaskar A.Sawant said that to ensure un-interrupted quality power supply to Agriculture Consumers, reduce the rate of Transformer burn and to prevent revenue loss of Discoms, this scheme is again implemented for the period of one month i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2016 to 31<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2016.. Earlier this scheme was effective upto 14<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2015.

Sh. Sawant said that under voluntary load disclosure scheme (VLDS), the agriculture connection whose period is over one year, if excess load found, no penalty will be charged and connection on it be regularised by depositing only security amount. The consumer's connection who have not completed one year, may regularise their connection by depositing security amount and Rs. 2500/- per H.P.(additional increased load).

Sh. Sawant said that The consumers whose connection period is less than one year and not regularise their load under this scheme, if excess load found during checking after the scheme they have to deposit (Rs. 2500/- + 2500) total Rs. 5000/- per H.P. of additional load.

Chairman Discoms said that agriculture consumers getting privilege of the scheme under scheme period, the expenditure of enhancement of capacity of distribution transformer, if necessary, new 11 KV line and sub-station will be borne by the Discoms.

Sh. Sawant said that The farmers who have installed another motor on the same well or have installed another motor on other well situated in the same Khasara/field/premises/Murabba are not entitled to take benefit under this scheme.

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
